On the 1st January 1915 I met my first wife whose maiden name was Annie Loyd at No. 98 Barkly St, Carlton, and kept company with her until the 5th January 1915 when I was married to her on that date at the Congregational Manse at The marriage was performed by the Rev. Richard Morrison Bowles, Fitzroy. Congregational Minister of Fitzroy. The witnesses to the marriage were Joseph Gilmour McIntosh, William Parrant and Brittomart Williams but I do not know where they reside. After the marriage my wife and I lived at 98 Barkly St Carlton for about a month and I then removed to Brunswick. Robert Thomson, Presbyterian Minister The witnesses to the marriage were Alexander McDougall and Smeaton.
